tional standpoint, the house corporation is working hard with our Capital Campaign Co-Chairmen Verner Chaffin (M 621) and Ben Hall (M 1360). Brothers Chaffin and Hall have worked tirelessly over the last year to lead the Capital Campaign during one of the most trying economic times that our Nation has ever faced. We are hopeful that you will act now to help conclude this effort on a positive note. Our final payments are due to UGA by December 31. If you have not given, please do so today. We need \$20,000 to complete the Campaign.

The house is full, including the excellent service by second year law student (and former Mu Commander) Bobby McMillin as the live-in "advisor". With academic year leases for each of the brothers and a waiting list for living in the house, we do not expect any challenges in keeping the house a 100% capacity.

Moving into any new home results in some lagging improvements and this move is no exception. Chiefly, installation of the permanent donor wall in the alumni room

(Winter 2010), installation of the bedroom and Pit donor appreciation plaques (Winter 2010), installation of all composites by UGA housing (Winter 2010), acquisition of 2 large hallway rugs, acquisition of 3 large (20x15) area rugs for the alumni room and great room, and installation of shutters on the exterior of the house (Spring 2010). Pending the final payment to UGA, we also look forward to some further enhancements to the dining room and alumni room by alumni brothers who have come forward with an interest in sponsoring those finishes. If you can help with any of these items, please let us know!

We welcome your attendance, input and participation. The Chapter is an excellent group and we would encourage you to meet and interact with them at the soonest possible moment. Mu Chapter succeeds because of you. Thank you for your continued support of time, resources and leadership.

On September 11th, 2009 the brothers of Mu chapter teamed up with the men of Sigma Nu from The University of South Carolina (Delta Chapter) to continue a long-standing Delta philanthropic tradition. Delta chapter has been participating in the event known as The Gameball Run for over twenty years, but for the first time in just as long, teamed up with the University of Georgia.

The event takes place annually the day before the South Carolina vs. UGA football game. The event

kicked off at William-Brice Stadium in Columbia, South Carolina with each brother of Delta chapter running a mile before handing the ball off to another brother. Once Delta chapter reached Augusta, Georgia the Gameball was handed off to Mu chapter. Two Georgia State Patrol Officers, as well as a charter bus containing the Mu brothers, escorted the runner with the ball on their 90+ mile run from Augusta back to Sanford Stadium. Fellow students who had read about the event in the university newspaper greeted the

Brothers with applause as they ran down Broad Street on their way back to the stadium.

This year Mu chapter raised more for St. Jude's than ever, holding various fundraising events including bowling tournaments, food sales, and corporate sponsorships. At this point Mu is proud to be able to donate over \$5,000 to the children's research hospital. Both chapters look forward to working together to continue this long-standing fundraising tradition.
