### Remembering Judge George Hearn

Judge George Justus Hearn, III (Mu 1048) entered into the Chapter Eternal on September 5th, 2014 at the age of 80. Judge Hearn, fondly known as Generalisimo, led a life dedicated to serving others.

While an active brother, Brother Hearn served Mother Mu as a Marshal and Lt. Commander. In a recent interview with Alumni Chair Sam McKinstry, Judge Hearn recalled some of his favorite moments as an active brother of Mu Chapter. Many of these moments involved large tailgates, Alumni events and parties; however and more importantly, Judge Hearn valued time spent bonding with his brothers of all generations.



Those familiar with Judge Hearn's many famous phrases will particularly remember his reference to membership in Sigma Nu as "a brotherhood for life." Judge Hearn lived these words as much or more than anyone.

Upon graduation from The University of Georgia, Judge Hearn returned to receive his law degree as a "Double Dawg." During his time spend in law school, Judge Hearn particularly bonded with his professor (and fraternity brother), Dr. Verner F. Chaffin (Mu 621). Dr. Chaffin, serving as Mu's alumni advisor at the time, grew very close to Judge Hearn. In a recent letter, Dr. Chaffin described Judge Hearn as "a man whose life was governed by the tenets of Love, Honor, and Truth. Judge Hearn set a consistent example of what it fully means to be a Brother in The Legion of Honor."

As an alumnus, Judge Hearn remained a guiding force for brothers on River Road, constantly reminding actives they have an "obligation to excellence" in all aspects of their lives. In addition to serving as House Corp. President for more than a decade, Judge Hearn was instrumental in the chapter revitalization in the early 2000's. Through his encouragement and leadership in the early years of the revitalization, momentum was maintained and "Mother Mu," a phrase he coined 30+ years earlier, was able to return to River Road. During the modern era of Mother Mu, Judge Hearn attended countless initiations and chapter meetings. When speaking at these gatherings, Judge Hearn encouraged men to live by the motto "S.T.E., Set The Example!" Judge Hearn always left a profound impact on all young brothers he met, encouraging them to join him in living according to our tenets of Love, Honor, and Truth.

Judge Hearn began a Hearn legacy in Mu Chapter which has been continued by his two sons, George (Mu 1845) and John Hearn (Mu 2000), grandson, Lee T. Williamson (Mu 2520). and many other Hearn cousins.

Judge Hearn's funeral was held at First United Methodist Church in his hometown of Monroe. Alumni and Collegiate Brothers from River Road lined the aisles during the service as the Chapter paid respects to the man who has influenced so many of our lives. After the burial and military honors, dozens of brothers in attendance gathered next to his resting place and recited the Short Creed.

Though Judge is no longer with us physically, Mother Mu takes pride in knowing it has a Knight looking out for the well-being of the Chapter and, through his legacy, guiding us on our "Obligation to Excellence."




## GRAND CHAPTER CONT.




## NEW BROTHER SPOTLIGHT
