Groundbreaking at River Road

As another Fall comes to a close in Athens, chapter morale is as high as it has ever been. Each and every active enjoys the privilege of driving down River Road and seeing continued progress on the construction on our new residence.

Over 100 Sigma Nu actives and alumni were in attendance to witness the Oct. 21, 2008 ground-breaking ceremony for our new House on River Road. Sigma Nu's outnumbered all others at the Ground-breaking by 2-1. It was a giant, tangible step forward in Mu's 12-year-long path to return to River Road.

The ceremony celebrated the opening of a new Greek Park with facilities housing Sigma Nu, Phi Delta Theta, Tau Epsilon Phi and Pi Kappa Alpha. Featured speakers at the event included University President Michael Adams and Vice President for Student Affairs Rodney Bennett. Dr. Verner Chaffin (M 621), who was also present at the groundbreaking of the original River Road house in 1940, addressed Sigma Nu members following the ceremony.

The new facility will house 20 men and be approximately 11,000 square feet in size. It will be located closer to Sanford Stadium than any fraternity house on campus. The house will be in the style of a French chateau, similar to that of the original building. It is scheduled to be opened by August of 2009, just in time for what looks to be a very promising Fall Recruitment.

House Corps leaders Dick Craft (M 1344), Gerry Whitworth (M 1492), Robert Durham (M 1650) and Alan Brown (M 1789), as well as Alumni Advisors John Hearn (M 2000) and R. Michael Barry (M 2071), showed tremendous leadership and perseverance in our returning to River Road.

The path back Home was not easy, but despite the adversity we faced, Mu Chapter has continued to be a strong presence on the University of Georgia campus. Since reorganizing in the fall of 2005, we have steadily grown in size and reputation—both locally and nationally. Thank you for continuing to believe in our Fraternity, our leadership and our vision. We look forward to seeing you on River Road.

students who put their own life in extraordinary danger in an attempt to save the life of another

Christopherson earned the Carnegie Hero Medal because of his successful attempt to save Daniel C. Broaddus during a vacation in Daytona Beach, Florida. Broaddus, 47, was wading in the Atlantic Ocean when he was caught in a

rip current.

Broaddus struggling and immediately ran into
the ocean to assist the drowning
man. He was
able to swim
with Broaddus to
a sand bar and

then on a diagonal course toward the shore, about 150 feet from where Broaddus was swimming. The man was given assistance at the shore by a lifeguard and is now fully recovered.

Christopherson is currently a junior biology major from Oxford, Georgia and plans on attending medical school. He has also served as Mu Chapter's Sentinel.


position of Vice President of the College Republicans, and Senior Wyn Bellhouse finishes his term as Vice President of the Young Democrats.
