“GAMEBALL RUN” SETS NEW RECORD

Mu Chapter raises over \$7,000 for American Heart Association

Each year, the “clean, old fashioned hate” of the Georgia-Georgia Tech rivalry culminates in the two schools’ battle on the football field. For the brothers of Sigma Nu Fraternity, however, the rivalry once again took the form of a competitive philanthropic event known as the “Gameball Run.”

Brothers from Mu Chapter left Athens early Friday morning *en route* to the Historic Gwinnett Courthouse in Lawrenceville. They each took turns running a football for one or two miles at a time, led by a police escort. They then handed the football off to brothers from Georgia Tech’s Gamma Alpha Chapter, who completed the seventy-mile journey to Bobby Dodd Stadium in Atlanta.

This year, Georgia emerged victorious, both on the football field and in the philanthropic arena, with Mu Chapter raising over \$7,000. Collectively, the two chapters raised a record-setting \$10,000 for the American Heart Association, through Sigma Nu Fraternity’s partnership with the Paul “Bear” Bryant Award, which is given annually to the top NCAA head football coach. Each chapter raised money through donations from individuals and small businesses.

Though the rivalry was heated, both chapters enjoyed the opportunity to join forces and support a worthy cause. This year’s “Gameball Run” was coordinated by sophomore John Huffines (Mu 2472). Both chapters hope to continue the event for a fourth year in 2012.

BROTHER TOM JOHNSON HONORED

Alumnus inducted into Atlanta Press Club’s Journalism Hall of Fame

On September 22, 2011, Brother Tom Johnson (Mu 1232, Alpha 208) was inducted into the inaugural class of the Atlanta Press Club’s Journalism Hall of Fame. The Hall of Fame recognizes individuals who have demonstrated journalistic integrity throughout their career, and who have made outstanding contributions to the state of Georgia or to the Atlanta Press Club.

Brother Johnson served as president of CNN during the 1990s before retiring in 2001. Before that, he served as publisher of the *Los Angeles Times*. Brother Johnson graduated from The University of Georgia’s Henry W. Grady College of Journalism and then from Harvard Business School, before becoming a White House Fellow during Lyndon Johnson’s presidency. He went on to work for President Johnson in Texas before taking the helm at the *Los Angeles Times*.

A longtime supporter and advisor to Mother Mu, Brother Johnson currently resides in Atlanta with his wife Edwina.

BOBBY WOODS HONORED AT CAPITOL

Army Airborne Ranger was wounded while serving in Afghanistan

On Monday, August 22, 2011, the Georgia House of Representatives honored Mu Chapter alumnus Bobby Woods (Mu 2300) with a special resolution commending his brave actions in Afghanistan.

Woods, an Army Airborne Ranger Captain, was leading his platoon in 2010 when they were ambushed by insurgents. Early into the firefight, he took a bullet to the head. After bandaging his own wounds, Bobby made sure his fellow injured soldiers were taken to receive medical attention. Instead of going with them, he retook command of his platoon, overcame the ambush, and led everyone to safety. Once at base, he sought medical treatment and was transferred back to the United States. Woods has been undergoing rehabilitation since the injury and has done so at an astonishing rate.

While the resolution was presented, many of the congressmen were casually chatting, as commendations are generally not for such heroism. Yet as the speaker told Bobby's story, the chamber fell silent. When the presentation was over, he was met with cheers and shouting.

Several active brothers and Mu alumni were in attendance as the resolution came to the floor, including Regent Robert Durham (Mu 1650) and Past Regent Joe Gilman (Mu 2440, Theta Tau 2).

Past Mu Chapter Commander Buck Dixon (Mu 2326) originally brought Woods' story to the attention of his hometown representative, who then began the process of drafting the resolution. "The House likes to give credit where credit is due, especially for wounded soldiers and people who put everything out there," Dixon said. "Everything went really smoothly. It's one of the first times I've heard hollering on the house floor — they usually just clap."

When asked what the most difficult part of the process was, Bobby said it was "leaving all the guys that looked up to me and counted on me every day when I first came back. I wanted nothing more than to go back and fight with them, and I wasn't able to do that. I would say that was definitely one of the hardest things."

Woods further demonstrated his selflessness by committing to spend the next year serving in England as a representative for the Wounded Warrior Project, an organization founded by his father that aids injured soldiers, including himself, during their recovery. Afterwards, he plans on attending business school.

Bobby Woods served his country the Sigma Nu way: with Love, Honor, and Truth; and we are glad that he can call Mu Chapter home.



MU CHAPTER HONORS MARCHMAN
46th Regent of Sigma Nu Fraternity enters Chapter Eternal

Former Regent Robert L. Marchman III (Xi 611) passed away on October 23, 2011. From his initiation until his death, Brother Marchman led a life of Honor through his service to the community and his dedication to the Fraternity.

Brother Marchman attended Emory University, where he served two terms as Commander of the Xi Chapter. After graduation, he served as a Division Commander and as a trustee of the Xi House Corporation Board. At the national level, he served as a member and as chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee; Vice Regent of the High Council; and as Sigma Nu's 46th Regent from 1978-1980. He then served as director, president, and chairman of the Sigma Nu Educational Foundation for over twenty years, and was inducted into the Sigma Nu Hall of Honor in 1976. Brother Marchman culminated his lengthy service to the interfraternal community as president of the National Interfraternity Conference in 1992.

Past Regent Marchman's passing has dealt a great loss to Sigma Nu, and his outstanding leadership will forever be remembered on River Road.
