The spring semester closed with two incredible speakers. On March 24th, Director of Football Administration Mike Cavan spoke to the

chapter. Coach Cavan played quarterback for the Dawgs from 1968-70, winning a SEC championship in 1968 and a berth in the Sugar Bowl as a sophomore. Following his playing days, Coach Cavan spent time as head coach at Valdosta State, East Tennessee, and SMU before returning to UGA as a scout from 1975-1985. As a scout, he is credited for bringing several great players to the program, most notably, Herschel Walker. Coach was able to tell us great stories about his playing, coaching, and recruiting days, and brought with him the national championship rings from 1980, 2021, and 2022.

Additionally, the chapter hosted professor Cecil Cooke on April 14th. Mr. Cooke graduated from UGA in 1975 with a degree in Risk Management and Insurance. He then spent 43 years in the insurance industry working for a variety of firms, including Marsh and Aon. Since 2018 retirement, Mr. Cooke has been teaching an insurance class, bringing various individuals in the insurance industry to his class, and spreading a myriad of information to his students. Mr. Cooke was kind enough to give the chapter advice on how to succeed as a student in Terry and in the insurance/business world.

The chapter is incredibly grateful for their time and hope to remain in contact in the future.
